General Membership Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month, January through May and September through December. Members gather at the Grange Hall overlooking the Port of Friday Harbor at 6:30 P.M. for a potluck dinner meeting. During the summer months of June, July and August, a picnic is held on the beach on Turn Island. Guests are welcome to all meetings.

BOARD MEETINGS

Meetings of the Board of Trustees are held the fourth Wednesday of each month at 5:30 P.M. in the conference room at Windermere Real Estate. Members are welcome to attend Board meetings. Thank you to Windermere for extending the use of their facility.

BYLAWS FRIDAY HARBOR SAILING CLUB

ARTICLE I

NAME

Section 1: The corporate name of this association shall be "Friday Harbor Sailing Club" (FHSC).

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

Section 1: The purpose of this Club shall be to organize, promote and encourage amateur sailing, racing and powerboat activities to include races and cruises and to provide regular social and educational meetings for its members and guests.

ARTICLE III

LOCATION

Section 1: The Club is located in Friday Harbor, WA 98250, PO Box 62.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: There shall be the following classes of membership:

- a) Senior: 21 years or older, with the right to cast one vote to hold office, to enter Club races and to represent the Club in other races; Initiation Fee: \$50.00, Annual Dues: \$70.00.
- b) Associate: 18 years or older, shall be entitled to all Club privileges but shall not be eligible to vote or hold office. Associate member may join only in conjunction with a Senior member.
- c) Junior: 12 - 20 years old inclusive, with \$10.00 initiation fee and \$7.50 annual dues with right to enter Club races and represent the Club in other races. Juniors who have completed a recognized sailing instructional course and apply for membership to the Club will have the initiation fee and first year's dues waived.
- d) Honorary Life: To be elected by unanimous vote of 2/3 majority of senior members, shall be entitled to all Club privileges but shall not be eligible to vote or to hold office unless entitled to do so at the time of such election. There shall be no more than five (5) such honorary members at any time and they shall be exempt from initiation fees and dues.
- e) Honorary Members: Each year the Commodore may appoint two Honorary Members to the Club. Such memberships will be for one year only and shall have the approval of the Board. They may not vote or hold office, and do not pay fees or dues.

Section 2: Dues shall be paid in accordance with schedules established by the Board of Trustees from time to time.

Section 3: Member's spouse and children under 18 years of age shall be entitled to Club privileges.

Section 4: Application for membership shall be made on a form supplied by the Club. Two senior members shall sponsor the application in writing. No application will be denied by reason of sex, age, color, creed, national origin, or marital status.

Section 5: The Board of Trustees by a 2/3 vote may reprimand or expel a member for unbecoming conduct or actions contrary to the purposes of the Club upon according such member a hearing after fifteen (15) days written notice which shall state the reason for such action. The member may appeal this decision within ten (10) days by written notice to the Commodore.

Section 6: Any member in arrears with his/her dues for more than three months may be dropped from membership by resolution of the Board of Trustees after notice to such member. If a member has resigned or has been dropped from membership for failure to pay his/her dues, he/she shall be required to pay current initiation fee upon reapplication for membership; but shall not be required to pay dues which were delinquent when he/she resigned or was dropped from membership.

Section 7: Junior members upon application after reaching the age of 21, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, shall become a senior member and pay senior membership dues, but need not pay any additional initiation fee.

ARTICLE V **OFFICERS**

Section 1: The elective officers of the Club shall be Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer, Fleet Captain and Social Chairperson..

These officers shall be elected at the November Annual Membership Meeting for the following Club year which shall extend from January 1 in each year and run for 12 calendar months thereafter.

Section 2: The Board of Trustees shall consist of the seven (7) elective officers and three (3) other members to be elected each year, each to serve for a term of 3 Club years, and the Staff Commodore. The Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the management of the Club. In case of resignation or death of a Trustee, the Board of Trustees will appoint a successor who will serve out the unexpired term.

Section 3: Honorary Officers of the Club may be the Fleet Surgeon, Judge Advocate, and Measurer. The Commodore shall appoint a Handicapper. He/she may appoint a Fleet Surgeon.

Section 4: The Commodore shall be the Senior officer of the Club and shall preside at all meetings of the membership and of the Board of Trustees. Each Commodore at the end of his/her term of office shall be Staff Commodore. He/she will be a voting member of the Board of Trustees until replaced by the election of a new Commodore.

Section 5: The Vice Commodore shall take the place of the Commodore in his/her absence. He/she shall act as Executive Officer to the Commodore and shall be in charge of the Club meeting room and arrange for the General, Special and Board meetings.

Section 6: The Rear Commodore shall take the place of the Commodore in the absence of both the Commodore and the Vice Commodore.

Section 7: The Secretary shall record, distribute and maintain a file of the minutes of the General, Special and Board meetings, and be responsible for the Club's correspondence.

Section 8: The Treasurer shall be the custodian of all funds of the Club, shall give necessary receipts for monies paid to the Club, shall deposit Club monies in the bank approved by the Board of Trustees in the name of the Club. Disbursement shall be made by the Treasurer, upon authority of the Board of Trustees, by check. He/she shall keep suitable books of accounts, shall make reports to the Board of Trustees and to meetings of the membership regarding the financial condition of the Club. He/she shall be bonded as directed by the Board of Trustees.

Section 9: The Fleet Captain. The Senior and the Junior Fleet Captains shall be in charge of all sailing activities of the Club and Chairpersons of the Protest Committee. The Junior Fleet Captain will serve one year and will automatically become Senior Fleet Captain the following year. The Senior Fleet Captain will serve as an advisor and mentor to the Junior Fleet Captain.

Section 10: The Social Chairperson shall be responsible for all Club social activities.

Section 11: The Handicapper shall, on application from the skipper member, assign a PHRF rating. He/she shall maintain a file of this data. He/she will consult with the Fleet Captain concerning ratings of boats of non-members entered in Club races.

Section 12: The Commodore, with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, shall annually appoint the Club's delegates or representatives to the Pacific International Yachting Association.

Section 13: The Board of Trustees may fill any vacancies, and its appointees will serve out the unexpired term.

ARTICLE VI **COMMITTEES**

Section 1: The Commodore shall appoint with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees such committees as the Board of Trustees may deem necessary.

ing to a warmer and dryer shore. The fleet expects a more competitive group for the next race in July.

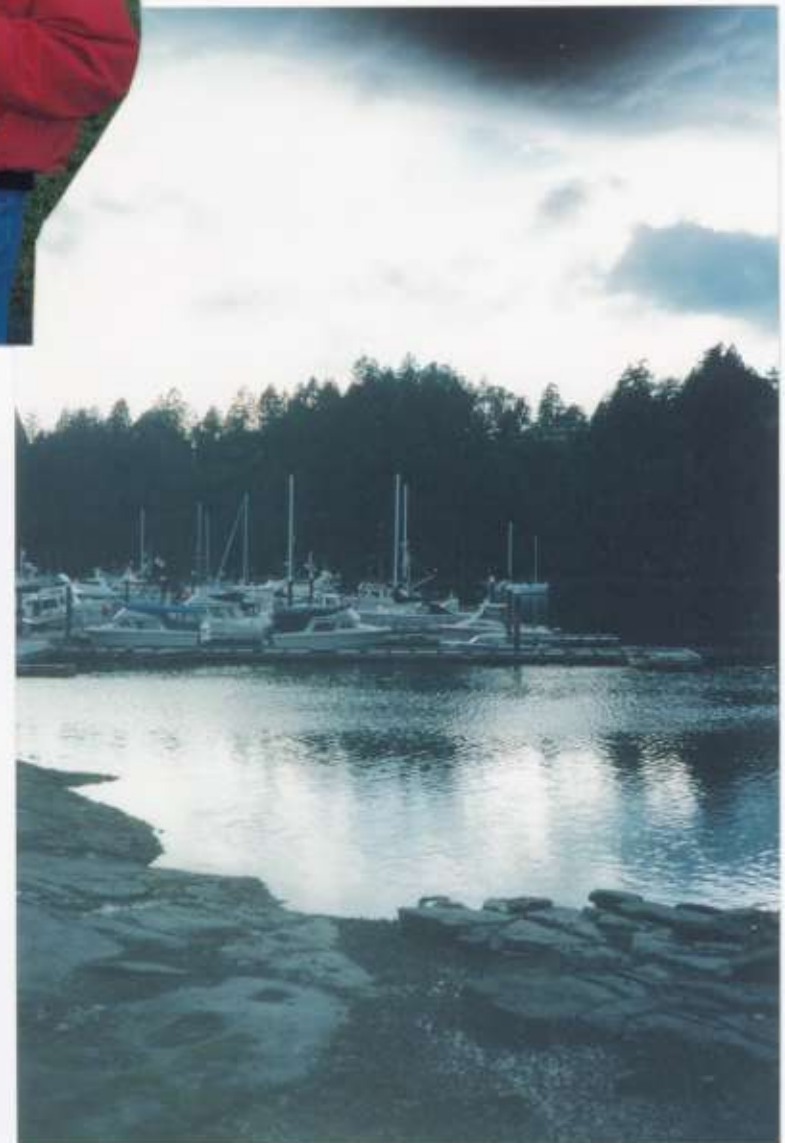

Honolulu to Friday Harbor

*12 women
sailing 65-foot
sloop across
the Pacific*

Barbera Marrett of Friday Harbor loves to sail and likes a real challenge. Voyaging with 11 other women from Honolulu to Friday Harbor on a 65-foot sloop certainly meets both criteria.

Sponsored by California's Orange Coast College, the Alaska Eagle departed April 2 from Wellington, New Zealand, for a partial Pacific circumnavigation to end in Newport, Calif., Aug. 27. The five-month cruise is divided up into eight segments, ranging from 12 to 20 days.

On the Hawaii to San Juan leg, the crew is led by Karen Prioleau, Carol Hasse and Marrett. This offshore voyage is designed for women who wish to refine their ocean passage skills.

Built by Sparkman and Stephens, the aluminum-hulled Alaska Eagle was launched as the Flyer for the 1977-78 Whitbread Round the World Race, which she won. In 1982, the boat was donated to Orange Coast. Under the OCC banner Alaska Eagle has sailed more than 150,000 miles with student crewmembers on board including 30 Pacific crossings.

Sailing from Hawaii to Friday Harbor is a lot tougher than going the other way. The prevailing winds flow down the mainland coast, then westward to Hawaii.

To sail home from the islands, the tactic is to reach north in the prevailing easterlies until you get to the Pacific High. Then you turn right either by sailing around it or motoring through it the middle of it.

This high moves around a lot from day to day, so guessing when to turn right takes both skill and luck.

Alaska Eagle is set to arrive in Friday Harbor Marina on Friday. For updates on her progress and email log, check out her web site: occsailing.com.

to San Juan Island leg pays \$3,150, which covers vessel operating costs, including fuel, food, port fees and repair expenses. Three meals a day on board are provided during the 2,350 nautical mile voyage.

Underway, two professional skippers work closely with crewmembers to increase their skills. Regular crew meetings are held to discuss a variety of offshore topics, from knot tying to heavy weather sailing. Other technical

aspects include overboard drills, firefighting, safety harness use, watchstanding, steering, trimming and changing the sails, keeping the log, navigating, reefing, anchorage selection, windlass operation, setting the anchor.

The Alaska Eagle cruises into Friday Harbor Saturday, ending a 2,350-nautical mile voyage from Honolulu. Twelve women sailed the 65-foot sloop. The voyage was done under the auspices of Orange Coast College's sailing school.

Pacific voyage ends successfully in F.H.

Wind-driven rain from a weekend storm couldn't stop the excitement Saturday in Friday Harbor as the all-woman crew of the Alaska Eagle finished its 2,350-nautical mile voyage from Honolulu.

Friends, family and well-wishers lined the dock as the 65-foot aluminum sloop moved gracefully into the harbor, the smiles of those aboard and ashore shining through the pelting rain.

Their adventure had begun in Hawaii on July 4. Through bouts of seasickness, close calls with freighters and some rough weather, the 12 women perfected their seamanship skills.

"I've always sailed with men," Barbara Marrett of Friday Harbor said. "They are usually good sailors with lots of experience and I tend to defer to them. With women, the decisions are

shared, each crewmember taking on more responsibility for the boat. That way, each of us gained more confidence in our skills."

The women on board range from a 19-year-old student to a 69-year-old grandmother; the average age is 43. There are six parents; five own boats and two of those are liveaboards. Sailing experience runs from three to 22 years with the average being 12.5.

Marrett at one time ran Harbor Press. The careers of the others give no clue as to their love for the sea. There is a doctor, computer programmer, techwriter, web consultant, bookkeeper, landscape architect, systems information designer and a student.

What were the best and the worst moments of the trip for Marrett?

"The best time came when we stopped in the middle of the

Pacific and scooped up two green Japanese fishing balls. Then we went swimming. All of us craved the exercise. It was great!"

Early in the cruise, Marrett was on watch with half the crew suffering from *mal-de-mer*.

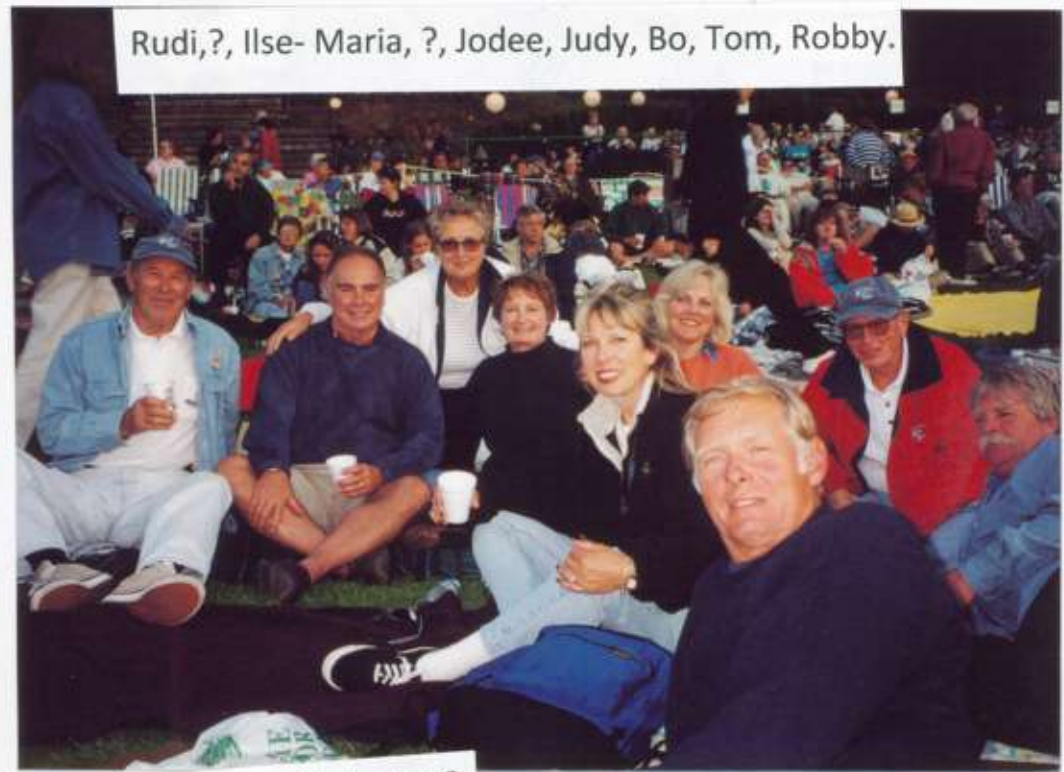
"I was trying to steer with three of them hanging over the rail and three others in the cockpit. Eventually all of us got used to the boats' movement, but it was touch and go for a while."

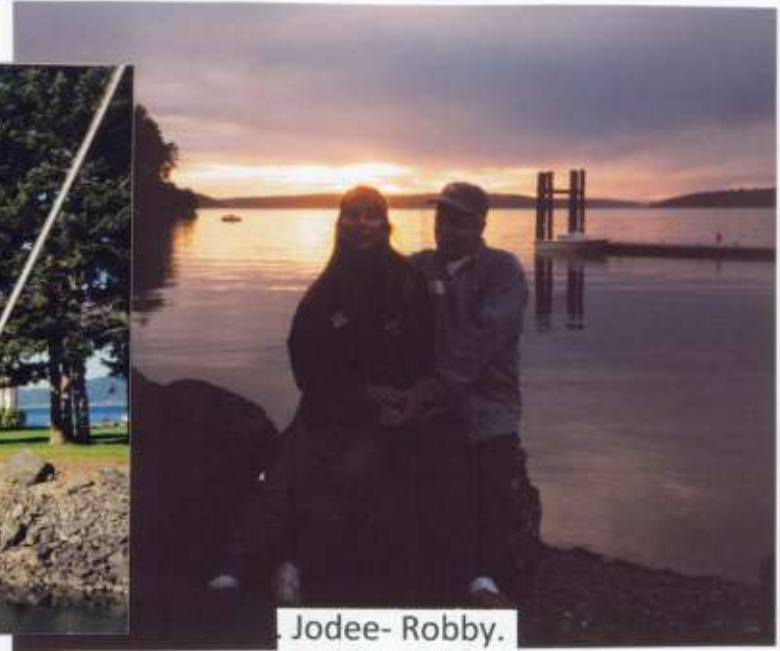

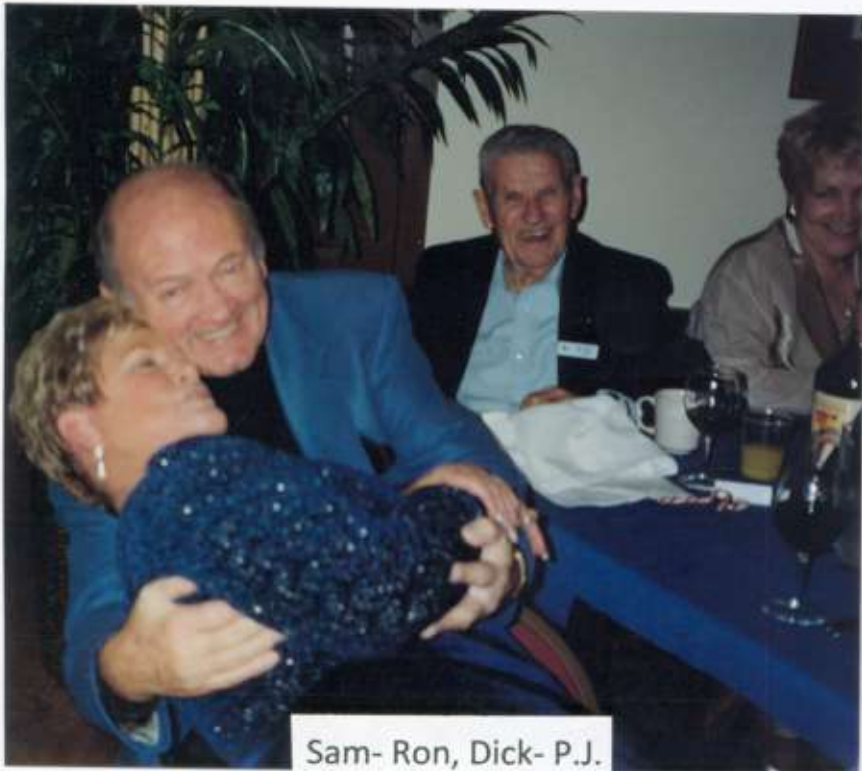
