General Membership Meetings are held the second Tuesday of each month, January through May and September through December. Members gather at the Mullis Center, 589 Nash St. right off Blair Ave. at 6:00 P.M. for a potluck dinner meeting. During the summer months of June, July and August, a picnic is held on the beach on Turn Island. Guests are welcome to all meetings.

BOARD MEETINGS

Meetings of the Board of Trustees are held the fourth Wednesday of each month at 5:30 P.M. in the conference room at Windermere Real Estate. Members are welcome to attend Board meetings. Thank you to Windermere for extending the use of their facility.

BYLAWS FRIDAY HARBOR SAILING CLUB

ARTICLE I

NAME

Section 1: The corporate name of this association shall be "Friday Harbor Sailing Club" (FHSC).

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

Section 1: The purpose of this Club shall be to organize, promote and encourage amateur sailing, racing and powerboat activities to include races and cruises and to provide regular social and educational meetings for its members and guests.

ARTICLE III

LOCATION

Section 1: The Club is located in Friday Harbor, WA 98250, PO Box 62.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

Section 1: There shall be the following classes of membership:

a) Senior: 21 years or older, with the right to cast one vote to hold office, to enter Club races and to represent the Club in other races; Initiation Fee: \$50.00, Annual Dues: \$70.00.

b) Associate: 18 years or older, shall be entitled to all Club privileges but shall not be eligible to vote or hold office. Associate member may join only in conjunction with a Senior member.

c) Junior: 12 - 20 years old inclusive; with \$10.00 initiation fee and \$7.50 annual dues with right to enter Club races and represent the Club in other races. Juniors who have completed a recognized sailing instructional course and apply for membership to the Club will have the initiation fee and first year's dues waived.

d) Honorary Life: To be elected by unanimous vote of 2/3 majority of senior members, shall be entitled to all Club privileges but shall not be eligible to vote or to hold office unless entitled to do so at the time of such election. There shall be no more than five (5) such honorary members at any time and they shall be exempt from initiation fees and dues.

e) Honorary Members: Each year the Commodore may appoint two Honorary Members to the Club. Such memberships will be for one year only and shall have the approval of the Board. They may not vote or hold office, and do not pay fees or dues.

Section 2: Dues shall be paid in accordance with schedules established by the Board of Trustees from time to time.

Section 3: Member's spouse and children under 18 years of age shall be entitled to Club privileges.

Section 4: Application for membership shall be made on a form supplied by the Club. Two senior members shall sponsor the application in writing. No application will be denied by reason of sex, age, color, creed, national origin, or marital status.

Section 5: The Board of Trustees by a 2/3 vote may reprimand or expel a member for unbecoming conduct or actions contrary to the purposes of the Club upon according such member a hearing after fifteen (15) days written notice which shall state the reason for such action. The member may appeal this decision within ten (10) days by written notice to the Commodore.

Section 6: Any member in arrears with his/her dues for more than three months may be dropped from membership by resolution of the Board of Trustees after notice to such member. If a member has resigned or has been dropped from membership for failure to pay his/her dues, he/she shall be required to pay current initiation fee upon reapplication for membership; but shall not be required to pay dues which were delinquent when he/she resigned or was dropped from membership.

Section 7: Junior members upon application after reaching the age of 21, with the approval of the Board of Trustees, shall become a senior member and pay senior membership dues, but need not pay any additional initiation fee.

ARTICLE V **OFFICERS**

Section 1: The elective officers of the Club shall be Commodore, Vice Commodore, Rear Commodore, Secretary, Treasurer, Fleet Captain and Social Chairperson..

These officers shall be elected at the November Annual Membership Meeting for the following Club year which shall extend from January 1 in each year and run for 12 calendar months thereafter.

Section 2: The Board of Trustees shall consist of the seven (7) elective officers and three (3) other members to be elected each year, each to serve for a term of 3 Club years, and the Staff Commodore. The Board of Trustees shall be responsible for the management of the Club. In case of resignation or death of a Trustee, the Board of Trustees will appoint a successor who will serve out the unexpired term.

Section 3: Honorary Officers of the Club may be the Fleet Surgeon, Judge Advocate, and Measurer. The Commodore shall appoint a Handicapper. He/ she may appoint a Fleet Surgeon.

Section 4: The Commodore shall be the Senior officer of the Club and shall preside at all meetings of the membership and of the Board of Trustees. Each Commodore at the end of his/her term of office shall be Staff Commodore. He/she will be a voting member of the Board of Trustees until replaced by the election of a new Commodore.

Section 5: The Vice Commodore shall take the place of the Commodore in his/ her absence. He/she shall act as Executive Officer to the Commodore and shall be in charge of the Club meeting room and arrange for the General, Special and Board meetings.

Section 6: The Rear Commodore shall take the place of the Commodore in the absence of both the Commodore and the Vice Commodore.

Section 7: The Secretary shall record, distribute and maintain a file of the minutes of the General, Special and Board meetings, and be responsible for the Club's correspondence.

Section 8: The Treasurer shall be the custodian of all funds of the Club, shall give necessary receipts for monies paid to the Club, shall deposit Club monies in the bank approved by the Board of Trustees in the name of the Club. Disbursement shall be made by the Treasurer, upon authority of the Board of Trustees, by check. He/she shall keep suitable books of accounts, shall make reports to the Board of Trustees and to meetings of the membership regarding the financial condition of the Club. He/she shall be bonded as directed by the Board of Trustees.

Section 9: The Fleet Captain. The Senior and the Junior Fleet Captains shall be in charge of all sailing activities of the Club and Chairpersons of the Protest Committee. The Junior Fleet Captain will serve one year and will automatically become Senior Fleet Captain the following year. The Senior Fleet Captain will serve as an advisor and mentor to the Junior Fleet Captain.

Section 10: The Social Chairperson shall be responsible for all Club social activities.

Section 11: The Handicapper shall, on application from the skipper member, assign a PHRF rating. He/she shall maintain a file of this data. He/she will consult with the Fleet Captain concerning ratings of boats of non-members entered in Club races.

Section 12: The Commodore, with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees, shall annually appoint the Club's delegates or representatives to the Pacific International Yachting Association.

Section 13: The Board of Trustees may fill any vacancies, and its appointees will serve out the unexpired term.

ARTICLE VI **COMMITTEES**

Section 1: The Commodore shall appoint with the advice and consent of the Board of Trustees such committees as the Board of Trustees may deem necessary.

Section 2: It shall be the duty of the Board of Trustees to appoint each year a Nominating Committee of five members, at least thirty (30) days before the Annual Membership Meeting, which shall select its own chairman. No more than two officers or trustees shall be appointed as members of the Nominating Committee.

ARTICLE VII
MEETINGS

Section 1: The Annual Membership Meeting shall be held on the second Tuesday in November, notice of which shall be mailed to all members at least ten (10) days prior thereto.

Section 2: The following order of business shall prevail at such General and Board meetings:

- a) Reading Minutes of previous meeting
- b) Reports of Officers and Committees
- c) Unfinished business
- d) Miscellaneous
- e) Election of Officers & Trustees (Annual Membership Meeting)

Section 3: Monthly meetings of the members of the Club shall be held in the designated place on the second Tuesday of each month, except that there is no such business during the summer months and December.

Section 4: Special meetings of the members of the Club may be called by the Commodore or at the request of a majority of the Board of Trustees, by giving ten (10) days written notice thereof to the members, stating the purpose.

Section 5: A majority of senior members of the Club shall constitute a quorum at any meetings of the membership and only members in good standing shall be entitled to vote. Voting by proxy absentee ballot shall be permitted.

Section 6: The Board of Trustees shall meet once a month in regular session on a day to be determined in advance by the Board. The general membership shall be notified of the Board Meeting schedule in advance. The Board may be called into session any time by the Commodore. Two thirds of the Board shall constitute a quorum.

Section 7: A quorum is defined as 51% of the voting membership, including any two Club officers.

Section 8: A simple majority of voting members when a quorum is present at any business meeting will decide all voted issues except as specified herein.

Section 9: Robert's Rules of Order shall govern all meetings when not in conflict with the Bylaws.

ARTICLE VIII
NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1: The Nominating Committee shall, not less than 20 days before the Annual Membership Meeting, nominate candidates for each of the elective offices and vacancies on the Board of Trustees, and at the same time mail such nominations to all members.

Section 2: Additional nominations may be made from the floor.

Section 3: No person may be elected without his/her consent.

Section 4: Elections may be held by ballot, by voice, or by show of hands.

Section 5: Removal from office: Any Officer or Trustee may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of the active members by secret ballot. No such action shall take place until notice has been posted and read at a previous meeting.

ARTICLE IX
FLAGS

Section 1: The Club Burgee shall be flown according to prevailing custom. The only boats which may fly the Club Burgee shall be Club sail or powerboats skippered by Club members.

ARTICLE X
PROPERTY RIGHTS

Section 1: The Club has no capital stock.

Section 2: No member of this Club shall have any right, title or interest in or to any property or assets which the Club may have or hereafter acquire except upon dissolution, according to law.

ARTICLE XI

Section 1: These BYLAWS may be amended at any annual or special meeting of the membership provided that notice of the amendment shall be given as one of the stated objectives of such meeting, and provided further that a copy of the proposed amendment is mailed to all members at least ten (10) days prior thereto. Amendments shall be approved by a simple majority vote of a quorum at a duly constituted meeting.

Little wind,

Let's see, how many words can I find to describe Saturday's 31st annual classic sailboat race around Shaw Island; languid, tranquil, halcyon, balmy, mild, placid...well, you get the picture.

Wait, can you say becalmed?

Of 78 entries into the race, only 40 made it in by the prescribed 6 p.m. finish time and more than a few needed a tow to get them back into port at all. Fleet Captain Ron Collins had made the requisite call to order up some wind, but was told by the manufacturer "the wind is back-ordered." Nice try, Ron.

In the never-ending quest for a fresh slant on things, I had signed up to follow the fleet in a chase boat. Travis Smith was gracious enough to let me ride on his new 19-foot Hewes aluminum work boat, a utilitarian vessel (that's right, no head) which nevertheless was seaworthy and fast, thanks to its light weight and serious 90 horsepower Honda outboard.

The chase boats are needed in Smith's words, to "Watch for boats in trouble, those drifting against the rocks in their search for wind, or in today's case to tow them in if they don't have an engine."

After an obligatory tour of his unnamed craft (which took all of 10 seconds), we blasted across the harbor to hook up with Collins' Evening Star, serving as race committee boat. OK, we didn't "blast" anywhere, Smith ever mindful of the inner harbor five-knot speed limit, but it seemed mighty quick compared to the ferries, especially at water level.

Just before noon, Friday Harbor had blossomed with 78 sailboats of every size, each skipper carefully using his engines to

get in the right spot for the race's start. To the north a patch of blue sky promised warm weather (well, warmish), but precious little wind materialized.

In fact it was hard to tell the race was underway, the only sign being the signal flags on the Evening Star and

the blast of the horn as the first racer of each class crossed the line and headed to port or starboard at their skipper's whim.

Each year, crews must decide whether to go clockwise or counter-clockwise around Shaw, the determinant factors being wind and currents.

Last year, most boats headed north, or clockwise and that proved the winning tactic. This time, about 20 boats bucked the conventional wisdom and took the clockwise circuit—four hours later, most had still not hit the

mid-course checkpoint.

Just north of Turn Point, the ferry Yakima stood off to let the race commence. Over the radio, Yakima's captain queried Collins, "So, another group comes out in five minutes, is that right?" All the boats crisscrossing every which way, their masts rising to the sky, made for quite a spectacle for the ferry's passengers lining the rails.

Travis and I wondered if they thought this might be a part of daily life here in the San Juans: "Hey, honey, if we moved here we could watch this every day. What a paradise!"

Crossing the line at a miserly one-half knot, Les Soland on Joyful Girl displayed a fine sense of the moment by yelling, "And away we go!"

The balance of the afternoon was spent blasting (literally) our way past the struggling yachts as they hoisted and dropped sails, raised colorful spinnakers and spread whisker poles in their efforts to catch the elusive wind; everything but start their engines.

As the day wore on some did

just that, bowing to the inevitable reality that a windless passage is a really slow one.

On the far side of Shaw, a gray seal popped up for a look—watching the boats ghosting along, drifting to nowhere, he decided no threat existed.

The constant pounding of hull against the swells took a toll on my bladder, so the high point of my day was an unscheduled stop at someone's deserted dock across from the Shaw ferry landing. Whoever you are, God bless. In second place would have to be Collins on his boat yelling at the top of lungs, "Get that boat out of the way!" to a clueless power boat skipper interfering with the line of sight at the finish.

Listed on this page are the final results for those who persevered. James Miller's Phoenix won the Dan Bentzen trophy for the shortest elapsed time, just about the same as last year's longest elapsed time.

The hopeful motto for next year's race? "Fair winds and following seas."

Boating center proposed on San Juan

Where there is now a decrepit shed once used for drying fishing nets, Les Gunther sees a boating center where kids sail and participate in boat-building projects.

Gunther, owner of the classic wooden boat Danae, pitched to the Friday Harbor Port Commission Jan. 9 the idea of building a Center for Wooden Boats at Jackson Beach.

Gunther said Dick Wagner, the director of the Center for Wooden Boats in Seattle, visited the island recently and sees it as "a good place for an annex for the Center for Wooden Boats ... he fell in love with Jackson Beach."

Gunther believes the center would be the catalyst for development or relocation of other maritime operations.

"With the center as a nucleus, other things would come

around," he said. "This is a natural medium for recreation and jobs."

The idea is pitched shortly after several agencies, including the port district, agreed to acquire the defunct Friday Harbor Sand & Gravel site for a 64-acre recreation complex.

Gunther and port officials see a boating center as an appropriate use near the recreation complex; months ago, Port Auditor Marilyn O'Connor dreamed of a boating center at the site of the old Jackson Beach cannery, which is for sale for \$5 million.

Jan. 9, O'Connor said others share that vision. "The Sailing Foundation would like to participate in any effort to develop a small sailing center," said O'Connor, a member of the foundation board of directors.

All told, Gunther sees the net-drying shed — located adja-

cent to the cannery on port-owned land — as an annex for the Center for Wooden Boats, a boat-building school and shop, and a meeting place for the Friday Harbor Sailing Club and the Sailing Foundation. The club now meets in the Grange.

The sailing club currently uses the drying shed, as does the Islands Oil Spill Association.

All Gunther needs now is community support, a lease from the port, and \$250,000 for construction costs to replace the shed with a new building.

"This will have to be a community effort. People are going

to have to put up their pennies," he said.

Gunther said the Center for Wooden Boats would oversee operations of the Jackson Beach office, but the office would be essentially independent, with its own employee and volunteers.

Commissioners liked the idea. "Let's talk about this and see where we can go," Greg Hertel said. Mike Ahrenius added, "The Center for Wooden Boats already has a tremendous amount of respect in Seattle."

The Center for Wooden Boats is a hands-on maritime heritage museum. It offers sail-

ing lessons, boat rentals, summer youth programs, and volunteer maritime projects. It also sponsors the Lake Union Wooden Boat Festival.

"It seems that we have the environment for getting people on the water without (them) having to own waterfront property or pay for dock space," said John Calogero of the San Juan Islands Maritime Heritage Association.

"It's a matter of pushing it over the hill and getting that initial investment."
